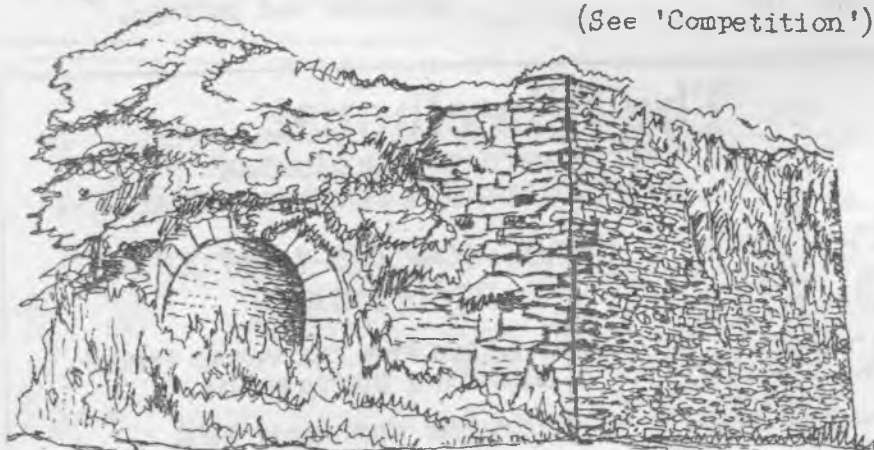
## Playgroup

## Parish Council

This month's meeting was held in the Chapel Hall at Trelights. It was a lively meeting attended by many of the villagers. The Chairman graciously gave 'permission to speak' on several occasions although not obliged to do so. Lets hope that some of those with opinions to express may consider putting themselves up at the Parish Council elections next year.

### Street Light, Church Hill

Since the electricity pole has to be repositioned anyway this will now only cost £98. Also SWEB will pay for 'energy and maintenance' so it was decided to go ahead with the light.

### Refuse Collection

Local traders and holiday cottages are to receive a circular to inform them of the correct time and method of disposing with refuse. It is hoped that this will help to prevent the present abuse of the bin on the Platt at Port Isaac.

### Footpath Trimming

Since there will be no Parish Council Meeting in August, it was decided to pay the contractors half their money until the paths have been inspected during the month, the balance to be paid after they have been reported to the September meeting. Action is also to be taken to try and get Doctor's Meadow path cut.

### Road Damage, Trelights

The road sweeping machine is reported to have caused damage and a letter to be sent to County Highways requesting that this machine is not used anywhere in Trelights or Port Isaac.

While discussing Highway matters, it was requested that there be a sign at the top of Church Hill banning large vehicles; also a sign

at the top of Rose Hill to tell motorists that it is impossible to turn on the hill.

The broken seat at Rose Hill will cost £38 to repair but will be paid for by the car insurance.

### BBC TV

The BBC will be filming part of "My Cousin Rachel" for one day only, Tuesday 28th. September at the Platt. We are asked to try and keep our cars away from the area. A voice called out: 'Let's all stop work for a day!'

### East Cornwall Hospital

Posters now available. A lunch at the Old School, and a 'SDP Dance'-style event at Port Gaverne Hotel to be held. Port Isaac Singers will also contribute proceeds from one evening on the Platt.

### Cliff Path, Port Isaac

Some funds have become available through the Countryside Commission so a grant may be available from County Hall.

## Wine of the Month

STRAWBERRY WINE

If you like strawberries  
then you will love this  
wine.

4lb. strawberries, 3lb.  
sugar, 1tblsp. citric acid,  
½tsp. grape tannin, 1tsp.  
yeast nutrient & pectolase,  
1pkt. wine yeast, water to  
1 gallon.

Remove stems and wash fruit.  
Mash berries, mix with sugar  
and 2 quarts water, add 1  
camden tablet and leave for  
24 hrs. closely covered.  
Strain and add all liquor to  
a demi-john, put in all the  
rest of the ingredients and  
fill the demi-john to the  
shoulder with water. Allow  
to ferment for ten days then  
fill to neck of jar and  
allow to ferment to finish.
