### PARISH COUNCIL

To correct any error we made last month, please note that the Chairman is Mrs. Cann, the Vice Chairman is Mr. Norris, and the Treasurer is Dr. Barron.

The following report is compiled from notes taken during the monthly meeting held at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac on Monday 8th. June. It is not always easy to hear what is discussed at these meetings and we would advise members of the public who wish to have accurate information on Parish Council affairs to refer to the Clerk to the Council.

### Finance

After payments about £630 will be left in the current account. The Tennis Club donation has been returned and will be added to the deposit account resulting in a balance there of about £1,310.

### Cost of Port Gaverne Toilets

The clerk presented an account of the costs involved in providing the facility, and the Parish Council found that the cost to them was only about £2,500.

### Pump, Middle Street

The housing will be re-pointed where necessary, and a small concrete pad constructed to hide the gap at the bottom of the pump which will then be repainted in its customary green.

### Community Bus

After a long discussion Mr. Dawe proposed that the Community Bus Committee be granted a guarantee of £1,200 being the sum they have to raise to start the operation if a bus is allocated to our parish in the autumn. This was seconded by Mr. Welton and carried by a vote of seven in favour.

## Trelights Village - 30 m.p.h. Limit

A unanimous decision was taken on Mr. Bolton's proposal, seconded by Mr. Norris, that Cornwall County Highways be asked for the speed limit.

# Rubbish at Cartway Cove

Clearing the rubbish from the Cove may be done during a Coastguard cliff exercise in the near future.

### Refuse in Polythene Bags

Following more problems with refuse scattered over Fore Street from a bag that had been attacked by gulls, a letter is to be circulated to all households advising against the use of these bags, and a reminder that Tuesday is the day for collection.

### Poltreworgey Hill

Mr. Hawken was present and the Chairman invited him to speak in reply to the letter complaining of mud on the road and debris on the grass verge. He asked why he had been singled out and was told that the Parish Council were following up a complaint they had received. Mr. Hawken then said that if the Council would keep down their nettles and docks on the new verges, he

would keep them clear of debris. The mud was caused by the cattle who had every right to use the road.

### Pump at Back Hill

A Community Programme scheme is to be considered for the tidying up of the site and to re-paint the pump at the same time. Mr. Norris asked whether the housing could be re-faced to conform with conservation area needs.

### Port Gaverne Valley Path - Stile

Since it would be difficult to contact the landowner, Mr. Bolton proposed that the Parish Council should repair the stile, which has a wobbly step. Mr. Dawe seconded this and it was agreed.

## Port Gaverne Toilets, Supervision

Mr. Bolton was asked if he would be responsible for keeping an eye on the toilets. He agreed to this but added 'I will lock them up if there is any vandalism!' He was asked to consult the Chairman before taking such action.

#### Discussion of Tenders

It was decided that the public and press will be asked to leave any meetings while tenders are being discussed.

### Footpath Allocations

The allocation of Councillors to inspect path trimming work will be decided at the next meeting.

### Waiting Restriction, Hartland Road

The notice was presented of an order to prevent cars parking on the corner by the doctors' surgery.

### Port Isaac Cliff Path

Recent correspondence between Mr. Hoskin and various authorities was read out. This concerned the intended use of the footpath as an access road to the proposed three houses. Mr. Welton ask-ed whether the Parish Council had seen detailed plans. As they had not yet been received he asked that the Planning Department be consulted. When invited to speak, Mr. Hoskin said that the intended use of the path as a road had got to be tackled. 'If we lose this path we'll never be forgiven.' discussion followed and strong feelings were expressed by most of the Council about the tragedy it would be if the path became a road. Mr. Stokes proposed that the Parish Council should legally attempt to take the path over. Mr. Bolton said that as it seemed to be impossible to establish who owned the land he would second this proposal. The clerk was therefore instructed to investigate the possibility. Mrs. Cann thanked Mr. Hoskin for his hard work.

## Report from Cilr. Symons

Apologising for his absence because he had to attend a District Council Planning and Development meeting, Cllr. Symons listed the new chairmen of the various committees and reported that he was himself on the Planning, and Housing committees. He had complained

to the Education Authority about their use of paraquat weedkiller in the children's play area at the playing fields. He had received an apology and a promise that the practice, normal in school playgrounds during the holidays, will be discontinued.

### Clerk's Correspondence

The National Trust lease for the Port Gaverne toilets has been received and is also being checked by Mr. Sproull, solicitor. A tree-planting grant application form was handed to Dr. Barron.

### Planning Applications

K.C.Richards, Dwelling at Higher Bodannon. Revised plans, re-siting the building further down the hillside, and behind the existing 'Coldstanton' bungalow, were passed on to the Planning committee with no observations.

#### **Public Discussion**

Mr. Knight said that there was little point in discussing the future of the cliff path at Port Isaac as the walled section would all be in the sea in five years or so. He had noticed that where he used to cut grass a few years ago had all gone, and the cliff seemed to be going back about a foot a year. The problem was also aggravated by rubbish tipping and the Parish Council should put up a sign. It was decided that the Parish Council would write to Cornwall County Council about the problem.

The public were asked to leave the meeting as a housing allocation was to be discussed.

### **Next Meeting**

The next monthly meeting of the Parish Council will be at the Church Rooms, Port Isaac, 7.30pm., Monday 13th. July.


